Dear Shipmate,

The Port of Portsmouth Maritime Museum Association (PPMMA) hired a company to make several test borings of the area around the edge of the basin Albacore rests in. The purpose of these borings was to determine the composition of the landfill that makes up the basin sides. Once the report is in hand, PPMMA can begin to address possible methods for stabilizing the basin walls. The probable increase in heavy truck traffic past the Park (see next paragraph) will only added to the urgency of implementing a solution to the crumbling basin wall problem.

The Maine-New Hampshire study on what to do about the downtown Memorial and Route 1 By-Pass bridges is edging toward a conclusion. Owing to the poor economy and great demand for state dollars, the current thinking is that the two-lane Memorial Bridge that connects Kittery to Portsmouth may be demolished and not replaced. The Sarah Mildred Long Bridge (Route 1 By-Pass bridge) may be replaced with a higher, four-lane bridge to be built to the west of the existing one. This would entail widening the Route 1 By-Pass roadway from two to four lanes, which in turn would move the roadway about 10 feet closer to Park property. Currently, the State of New Hampshire leases from PPMMA the connector road in front of the bow of Albacore that joins the By-Pass to Market Street. The state would most likely take by eminent domain that road, the bridge that crosses over a small channel and some additional Park property alongside the road. Stay tuned.

The Friends of Albacore Committee decided to take advantage of a PPMMA offer to join them in financing a new printing of 500 copies of the soft-back version of the Robert Largess and James Mandelblatt book "U.S.S. Albacore, Forerunner Of The Future". The book sells well at the museum store and supplies are running low. We expect to realize almost double the cost of our investment from sales of this popular book.

NavSea conducted its annual inspection of Albacore on 10 July. Overall, the inspection appeared to have gone well. PPMMA is still waiting for the official report.

From first hand experience as the OOD for Condition 1AS operations on a DD back in that time, the story rings lots of familiar bells with respect to the difficulty in finding, tracking and attacking a sub in those days - especially a very maneuverable one like Albacore.

To date, we have placed 79 memorial blocks in the Garden. Four new blocks have been ordered for Marvin Bissonnette, Mike Murray, Frank Sardinha, and Frederick "Pete" Smith. We have 16 blocks remaining. If you would like to order a block to mark your time on board or if you would like to honor a shipmate, a form is provided at the end of this letter and also on our website. Each 4 X 8 granite block has room for three lines of up to 13 spaces per line. The engraving is highlighted in black. The cost is \$60 for a block.
